Oral Statement submitted by VIDES International – International Volunteerism Organization for Women, Education and Development

And co-signed by IIMA – Istituto Internazionale Maria Ausiliatrice delle Salesian di Don Bosco

We welcome the report of the Special Rapporteur on the right of development on his visit to Honduras.

We commend Honduras' commitment to education as a cornerstone of development as it continues to strive to improve its infrastructure especially in rural and underdeveloped communities. However, we are concerned by the fact that 40% of children are not in school.¹

In line with the Special Rapporteur's Report, IIMA and VIDES recommend to:

- 1. Increase resources and budgeting for bilingual education especially for the indigenous and Afro-Honduran communities; preserving language and cultural identity. ²
- 2. Ensure free quality education for all, by continuing the efforts to improve school infrastructures, especially those affected by natural disasters, and increasing teacher pay and training.³
- 3. Adopt specific measures to empower girls and young women, that include promoting their participation in education and businesses and combating early pregnancies.⁴
- 4. Adopt and effectively implement laws and reforms to protect children and women from violence and discrimination everywhere.⁵
